MEETING MINUTES FROM APRIL 19th, 2007

Jerry Remillard, our president, called the meeting to order shortly after 7:00. As usual, he recommended that members join the AAW for the benefits of their insurance, quarterly magazine, member's directory and symposiums.

We had one guest this month and also one new member. Welcome to our club.

No time was wasted before our program on **Carving Turned Objects** started. There were many different techniques shown by several different club members. Jerry must have been thinking 'ladies first' since **Alva Pixley** (who returned recently from a symposium in Arizona) was the first called on to demonstrate her recently learned techniques of carving utilizing a Colewood SuperPro11. This is a heated instrument that burns the wood. She recommended buying separate tips that are permanently mounted to a handle. She explained how she transfers patterns on paper to the wood. Our next demonstrator was actually the young granddaughter **of Ron Purcell**. Both Ron and Molly use a similar tool, also by Colewood. They prefer the less expensive tips that can be interchanged in the single handle. I'm sure that **Molly** can start to teach her grandfather a few of her techniques for shading. Ron added his other carving techniques and showed some very intricate pieces, and explained how the legs that he expertly creates help 'lift' the bowl up from the surface that they are set upon. Ron said that you can use anything with teeth to carve and also many other power and hand tools. If it works for you, "go for it" and if not, find another method to achieve what you want to do.

Carl Spinnler continued the meeting showing his unique finishing techniques for carving natural edge bowls when the bark peels off and, also, for changing the edge that was

turned on the lathe into something more unique. He recommended files, Dremel tools with various bits and Fordham handpieces with reciprocating saw inserts. Flex cut blades were mentioned and electric carvers were demonstrated. Carl was followed by **Warren Howie** who invented an ingenious way to draw a line on a bowl while still on the lathe for later cutting into lobes or equal segments. Using an inexpensive laser light placed on a flat surface and aimed at the bowl, very interesting, uniform divisions can easily be added. The difficult part that Warren made look easy was carving and smoothly sanding the recesses.

Following the carving demo, Ron Purcell, our treasurer, said that there is \$7472.00 in our treasury. Rick Pixley mentioned that he has another \$800. check that will be added to that balance.

It was reported that the show in Weston, Fl. was terrible for our members and that we would not participate in it again as there were few attendees and they were not buying.

Lee Sky is responsible for lending the club's many tools to members to try out. He recommends calling him before coming to his studio to check them out.

Our library of CD;s, DVD's Books and other videos is managed by **Jim Kal**. They are set up at our meetings so you can easily check them out.

The only OLD BUSINESS that was mentioned is that **Ron Purcell** still has large and very interesting pieces of African mahogany at his home. You will need to call him and make arrangements to pick it up from him. Some are quite heavy.

Jerry mentioned two upcoming symposiums- one in Utah that he said is almost as good as the national symposium and another excellent one that will be in Atlanta, Ga.

Lee said that his employer is closing a large warehouse and has many wonderful shelf units that he is selling for very reasonable prices.

Our INSTANT GALLERY had, as usual, much variety. Pieces were made of some interesting woods including Brazilian BeautyLeaf, Norfolk Island Pine, Cedar and Black Walnut. There were miniatures by Ron Purcell and Diane Klein, bowls and boxes by other members, spin tops and a centrifugal turned item that spins a coin into a box as a donation to a lovely nature reserve and park in West Palm Beach.

We had our bring back raffle before the meeting ended. . . And after the end of the meeting, Lee conducted another raffle because 2 men in the tree removal business brought a large truck filled with a variety of hardwoods that they offered to our members. Excited turners anxiously took turns selecting pieces to be turned into wonderful objects. I'm sure there will be a discussion of this raffle at our next meeting.

Our board meeting will be at Lester's Diner on Tuesday, April 24th at 6:30 or 7:00. Members are always welcome to join us for dinner and a short meeting.

David Kerzel is our web master and hopes that you will send him relevant articles to post on our web site. David also manages our newsletter. Diane Klein is the club secretary.
