Minutes for Gold Coast Woodturners meeting –September 20, 2007

Jerry Remillard, our president, called our meeting to order at 7:00. As usual, he recommended that members join the AAW for the benefits of their insurance, quarterly magazine, member's directory and symposiums.

We had several interested guests this month. One of the guests became interested by attending our club's demonstration at the Ft. Lauderdale library. The other had taken a class at John Campbell and wanted to refresh his memory on what he has forgotten. We hope they both will become members of our club.

We immediately started the meeting with **Jay Ward's** excellent demonstration of making pens. Jay had a mystery piece of plastic to make into a slim line pen. He said that all types of materials can be used including acrylics, Corian as well as the full range of beautiful woods. Each style of pen requires it's own set of bushings and spacers, nibs, finials, mechanisms, clips, etc. Jay stressed the importance of being very organized so as not to mix these bits and pieces up. Jay suggested using a brad tip drill bit to get a straighter and cleaner hole before mounting on a mandrel. Mandrel and make sure that your blank ends are perfect 90

Jay has learned many time saving tips from experience and problems. He shared many of these ideas so that interested turners will avoid the problems that he had to solve. Be careful when drilling. . . use a drop of water on acrylics. . . and step drill and remove dust before continuing to drill a bit more. NEVER drill deeper at a time than twice the diameter of the bit. I hope this makes sense.

Remember that plastics overheat quickly. After Jay was satisfied with the shape and made sure he was happy with the taper toward the bushings he sanded with MICRO MESH pads to get a glass-like smooth finish.

Jay mentioned the importance of a full face mask and proceeding slowly with Corian.

Following his excellent demonstration we had a short break while some of our members quickly shopped.

Rick Pixley is our new show chairman taking over from **Ray Reiland** who has expertly acted as chairman since 1992. Thanks Ray for all of those years of hard work.

Rick mentioned an upcoming juried show that we will be participating in. This is the **City of Hollywood** show on **Oct. 18 and 19** at Young Circle in Hollywood. Those who will be exhibiting share the entry cost of \$300. Ten percent of the profit will be given to the club. . .

On **Dec. 8th** there will be a grand opening of the new art school, also in Hollywood and we will be participating in that opening.

Again we will be participating in the **Fairchild Tropical Garden**, Miami Ramble on Saturday, **November 17, 2007 - Sunday, November 18, 2007**. Last year our club took in more than \$16,000. Please let Rick know if you will be participating in this fantastic event.
