Minutes for Gold Coast Woodturners meeting –August 16, 2007

Carl Spinnler called our meeting to order at 7:05 since our president, Jerry Remilard was not able to be with us. As usual, he recommended that members join the AAW for the benefits of their insurance, quarterly magazine, member's directory and symposiums. We had several interested guests this month. Two of the guests had taken turning classes from Lee Sky, and another had seen our display at the Ft. Lauderdale library.

We immediately started the meeting with **Lee Sky's** demonstration of making finials. This was done in preparation for a demonstration and turning classes to be given by 'the queen' of finials, Cindy Droza, this winter in W. Palm Beach, the weekend after Thanksgiving. This will be sponsored by the W.P.B. turning club.

Lee stressed the importance of straight and tight grained wood like African Blackwood, Ebony, and crabwood, etc. Making a finial is very similar to spindle turning and uses all 3 basic turning shapes, concave, convex and straight. He prepared a 'hand-out' for members showing various finials. Thanks Lee.

Lee showed several ways to mount the blank using jam chucks, the center of a 4 jaw chuck and even using a Jacob's chuck. It is always important to true up the cylinder even if it had be trued up prior to remounting.

It was recommended that you start with the tail stock supporting the blank. Something that we may forget is the importance of a 'pristine' tool rest which should be filled, sanded and rubbed with wax before starting. When finishing, Lee mentioned the importance of light, deliberate and careful sanding being careful of losing the crisp and sharp elements of your finial. Lee even mentioned being aware of your breathing when turning and exhaling over intricate details.

I'm sure that all attendees learned some important tips. This demo was expertly videographed by Ken Rizza.

OLD BUSINESS:

Lee mentioned our club's display at the library in Ft. Lauderdale at Broward Blvd. and Andrews. It will be there until the end of the month.

Ron Purcell described our new club's trailer which is 6' x 12' and has both rear and side doors. We will keep lathes, etc. in it for club projects and shows.

Our club owns many tools for members to check out, and our library of CD's, DVD's Books and other videos is set up at our meetings so you can easily check them out.

NEW BUSINESS:

Diane Klein spoke about the Christmas Tree auction at the Galleria in Ft. Lauderdale. She feels that we should plan early and try to get approval for a unique tree that would better 'show off' our club's expertly made wooden items. In previous years the ornaments that we made didn't show up as clearly amid the branches of the green artificial trees. Diane will chair this committee and contact members for donations.

Rick Pixley gave us information about upcoming shows that we participate in and also others that we should all consider. These are good money makers for our members and also for our club. The Fairchild Show is Nov. 17 and 18. Other shows we should think about are Pembroke Pines, Davie's Flamingo Gardens Show, and the new inaugural show and demo at the Hollywood's Arts Park in December. The Palm Beach club will also have another show.

Carl said that Jerry, our president, would like to move the nominating of next year's officers to an earlier date.

Pieces were made of some interesting woods and synthetics including mesquite, saponilla, rosewood, and the ever popular, Norfolk Island Pine as well as acrylics. Saturday, August 25, 2 p.m., at the Main Library**

BROWARD COUNTY, FL – The Gold Coast Woodturners Association will give a presentation on Saturday, August 25, 2 p.m. at the Main Library, 100 S. Andrews Avenue, Fort Lauderdale. The Broward County group will demonstrate how to turn raw wood into beautiful objects, ranging from small serving bowls to furniture pieces.

The members will show and describe their pieces, how the pieces are crafted, shaping the wood and types of wood used in the projects. Two cases of the Gold Coast Woodturners Association's pieces are on display on the second floor of the Main Library in August.

We had a very successful woodturning demonstration at the Broward County Main Library Saturday. Almost 70 people were in attendance. We got off to a slow start with a lathe malfunction but Jerry Remillard & Glenn Carrigan were quick on the repair to get some chips flying. I started by explaining woodturning and tools following with wood selection & which trees in our area we prefer to turn. Then onto making a small bud vase. Many questions were asked by the audience.
